### PASTORAL VISITS

Please remember to keep Dr Groenewald informed about anyone known to you who is ill, either at home or in hospital, and who would welcome a visit from him.



'Out of the mouth of babes . . .' we say, meaning that children can, in their innocence, often say what adults might be thinking but would not say, whether out of fear of reprisal or sensitivity to others' feelings. In these days of political correctness, the bluntness of

children can sometimes feel like a breath of fresh air. And sometimes they can capture in a simple image what theologians and philosophers have written whole books about. Rev David Black, who led our worship for two Sundays in July, gave us a marvellous instance of this.

When asked what a saint is, the child replied: 'A saint is someone that the light shines through.' The child was thinking of stained glass windows in churches but how loaded with meaning and metaphor that is!

'We have this treasure (Christ in us) in jars of clay' or, as the old King James Version puts it, 'in earthen vessels' (*2 Corinthians 4:7*). There is a well-known painting, inspired by this scripture, of a cracked and rather unlovely vase with beautiful light seeping and spilling out through its cracks. That child unwittingly expressed the same truth.

David's essential message to us over two Sundays was that 'God is light and in him is no darkness at all' (*1 John 1:5*). Our only and most effective weapon against the darkness that seems, in a season of terrorist tragedies, to be closing in around us is to let the Christ-light within us seep and spill out - however cracked and unlovely we may be feeling! He reminded and

reassured us: the light has shone in the darkness *and the darkness has never been able to put it out.*'

Brenda spoke to us, at the end of July, about how we might guard ourselves against possible terrorist attacks in places of worship. Official guidance goes down the line of checking litter-bins, preventing vehicles parking outside churches and being wary of strangers. We can subscribe to this view, close ranks and live in fear. But is this the 'armour' we, as vessels of the light, should be putting on?

She reminded us of how Peter acted out of fear and self-preservation when Jesus was arrested and how very differently he and the other disciples acted after Pentecost, once they had been filled with the Holy Spirit. We too – children of the 'new covenant' with God - are filled with this Spirit, that very light which *will* find a way out through the smallest crack in the dirtiest vessel and make the ground we stand upon become holy ground.

She exhorted us to remember Esther who was 'born for such a time as this' and to rise up to accept that we are born for *this* time. God has placed us right here, right now, for a purpose: to put on the armour of God and stand firm, now that this day of evil has come.

In another sermon a few weeks later, she spoke of seasons in people's lives and urged us to ask God to make plain to each of us what season we are in. Is it a time to weep or a time to dance? A time to act or a time to wait? One thing is plain for all of us: it is a time, as the old song says, to 'let our little light shine'!

### The Church's Financial Position - August 2016

The 2016 Annual Budget presented to the Congregational Board members earlier this year projected income of £110,775 and expenditure of £116,461 which would result in a deficit of £5,686.

From an accounting perspective, the Congregational Board agreed in June to move from Fully Accrued Accounts to Receipts and Payments reporting with immediate effect. The accounts produced at the end of this year will be in a different format, but will continue to show comparative figures for the previous year.

All of the following financial information is correct as at 21<sup>st</sup> August 2016.

Our current overall income is £74,608 which is ahead of budget by £465 (0.6%). Within this figure, our offerings total of £55,658 is ahead of budget by £1,324 (2.4%).

The income derived from people and groups using our church premises is under budget by £802 (23%). However, our income from both weddings and funerals and fundraising activities is ahead of budget by £2,296 (229%) and £584 (39%) respectively.

Our general expenditure to date is £80,602 which is over budget by £196 (0.2%).

The cost of looking after our church buildings is £14,610 to date, which is £1,923 (15.2%) over budget. This is primarily due to investing in upgrading the audiovisual equipment in our church buildings and painting the church hall in Kirknewton. As a church family, we remain indebted to the volunteers who help to maintain our church properties.

I would urge anyone paying income tax on their salary or pension to complete a Gift Aid form. Donating through Gift Aid means that we can claim an extra 25p for every £1 you give for our church, at no extra cost

to you. Our Stewardship Convenor, will be happy to answer any questions you may have regarding Gift Aid.

If you wish to set up a standing order, or start using Weekly Offering envelopes, then please discuss this with me.

I would ask that you please give the finances of our church your prayerful consideration and thank you for your continued support.

**The ASM in 2017.** A date for your diaries. The ASM will take place on the evening of Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> March 2017. The business will be followed by a cup of tea and a biscuit.

From **Stewardship and Finance Department at 121** a note of thanks for this congregation's support of the work of the Church through our Ministries and Mission Contribution. In 2016 we will give £65,361. £55,753 of this contribution will go Ministries to support the costs of providing ministers and parish workers. As the cost of providing a minister is £41,507, we are meeting the full cost of our ministry and supporting other congregations whose income is not sufficient to meet the cost of a minister. Do note that this figure is not what our minister is paid – it includes all the overheads of employing somebody e.g. National Insurance. The balance of £9,608 will go to Mission and is used to support the Church's work and administration. What happens to £10 in the offering bag? £4.20 is kept by us; £4.88 pays for our ministers; £0.92 provides important help for congregations and supports the mission of the Church.





It doesn't seem that long ago since we all stopped for summer. The Family Outing to Scoughall was a great success and a fantastic way to end the term. We had about 50 people aged between 2 and 102 all chatting, eating, playing and paddling together. There was a great feeling of fellowship and sharing.

Our new year of EnerJ starts on 4th September. This year we are taking one of our songs each week and will look at what it teaches us. Once a month, we will have a different week where we will look at a character in the Bible and explore what they did.

Please remember our children who are starting nursery, school and of course our girls that left last year who are going on to high school, in your prayers.

Please also pray for God's guiding and sustaining of the leaders as we seek to do His will.

### Pants for Ghana!

My daughter was quite overwhelmed by your response for my appeal in the May magazine for children's pants. She goes out to Ghana every year, with a group from her church in Prestonpans, to partner with local churches out there and offer spiritual teaching and practical help. The rule in Ghana, no doubt for hygiene and infection control reasons, is that children cannot come to school if they have no pants. Many families are single-parent and very poor with several children. Some families have no parents (the AIDS epidemic is largely to blame) and the oldest child is doing his or her best to fill the parental role for the younger ones. Even putting pants on all of them is beyond the means of such families and so the children miss out on their education.

Your generosity was tremendous and I took two enormous bags, labelled BOYS and GIRLS, down to my daughter a few weeks ago. She was in the middle of moving house so the bags were put into a cupboard for the time being. She phoned me a few days later: 'I can't believe how generous your church has been! Please thank them all from me. I think you are wonderful!'

I will ask her to write a wee report on this year's visit in late August, especially how the pants went down - so to speak!
